

ESOL TRAINING LEVELS

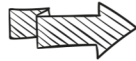
Effective January '02, the State requires instructional personnel to complete a minimum of 18 or 60 inservice points in ESOL prior to the last contract day of your 2nd contracted year of employment.
If you have not completed the requirement, you are not eligible for rehire.

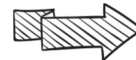
LEVEL 2 (60 Hours)



Exceptions are: AVE, EPE, GTE, HLE, LTE, LES, MES, PCR, PSE, VOE ---- They are all LEVEL 4

- Principals, Assistant Principals, Guidance Counselors and Deans
- English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Computer Literacy Teachers
- Reading Teachers without ELL students
- ESE Inclusion, ESE Co-Teachers and ESE Resource Teachers (There must be a 300 hour teacher in the classroom with the inclusion teacher)
- Language Arts and ESE Language Arts Teachers (who do not teach ELL students)
- Elementary Teachers (who do not teach ELL students)
- Resource Teachers
- Social Workers
- ACT Program

LEVEL 4 (300 Hours)

- Elementary and Secondary Language Arts Teachers (who work with ELL students)
- ESE Language Arts Teachers
- ESE Resource Teachers (who work with ELL Students)
- Varying Exceptionalities
- Reading Teachers (who teach ELL students)

LEVEL 5 (120 Hours)

- Teachers who have passed the State ELL SAE, (Subject Area Exam) must complete **120** in-service ELL hours to **meet state mandated requirements**.

IMPORTANT

- If you are a Level 1 and transfer to Level 2 or Level 4, the 18 Hour Survey course does not count toward any of the hours required for Level 2 or 4.
- Level 2 - the 60 Hour Content course can be used towards the 300 hours; it will count for either Cross Cultural Communications or Methods of Teaching ESOL.
- If you have completed any ESOL Trainings/Courses while attending college, you are responsible for submitting an unofficial transcript to the ESOL Department for review. Upon approval and entry of points, you will receive an e-mail notification from the Department of Professional Learning.
