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	<p>School Goals:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Establish a health and wellness council that meets regularly at the school 2. Enforce a policy that bans all tobacco products on school property 3. Enhance Lunchroom Environment to encourage students to choose healthier foods such as food placement, posters, and suggestions by cafeteria personnel 4. Ensure foods and beverages served outside of school hours meet the USDA Smart Nutritious snack standards, including after-school fundraisers, concession stands at sporting events, ect (will discuss this with PTA to determine whether to do this policy action due to some of their fundraisers) 5. Discontinue using food as rewards 6. Update cafeteria equipment to support provision of healthier foods 7. Integrate physical activity into daily lesson plans outside of physical education class to help students stay focused and energized. 8. Require that students are physically active during the majority of time in physical-education class 9. Incorporate “lifestyle-focused” activities into your school’s physical education curriculum 10. Require 150 minutes per week (elementary schools) and 225 minutes per week (High and middle schools) of physical activity for all students 11. Require students to pay for unhealthy foods in the cafeteria with cash 12. Prohibit consumption of foods and beverages, other than water, in classrooms and hallways 13. Do not use or withhold physical activity as punishment 14. Celebrate birthdays and other events involving food no more than once a month 15. Require twenty minutes of recess daily for student (elementary only) 16. Offer recess before lunch (elementary school only) <p>Program Actions</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1.
