Welcome!

Hello everyone, thank you for enrolling in AP Human Geography!

Have you ever looked at the world and asked, “Why?” This course offers the answers to all of those “why” questions. APHUG will make you a well-informed, global citizen. You will gain a lot of insight regarding how the world operates and how that impacts your life as a result.

This summer assignment is the first step in this process. The goal of the assignment is to prepare you for the course by exposing you to themes and concepts that will be utilized throughout the year.

PART I:

The course is organized around 7 topics/units, which are:

1. *Geography: Its Nature and Perspectives*
2. *Population and Migration*
3. *Cultural Patterns and Processes*
4. *Political Organization of Space*
5. *Agriculture, Food Production, and Rural Land Use*
6. *Industrialization and Economic Development*
7. *Cities and Urban Land Use*

Your summer assignment is to apply the above course topics and gather data on the United States. Complete each of the 7 parts outlined below based on independent research.

The Assignment

Part 1:

Maps

Create (by hand) a reference map of the United States on an 8.5x11” piece of paper. Your map should include:

- State borders and names
- The capital
- Major physical features (Mississippi River, for example)
- Major cities
- A legend or key, if needed

Part 2: Population

1. What is the population of the United States? Where does it rank globally?

Population pyramids, or age-sex pyramids, provide basic data about the demographics of a country. Find a population pyramid for the United States, print it out, and use it to answer the following questions:

2. Is the population balanced in terms of sex, or does one represent a significantly larger portion of the population than the other?
3. Find a bulge in the population pyramid and look at the age of the people the bulge represents. What age, and then in what years were those people born? Look at what was happening historically in the United States at that time, and explain how it may have contributed to this population bulge.
4. Population pyramids convey information about population growth; if the base is broad, many babies are being born and the country may have population growth. Look at the base of the US's population pyramid. Based on this data set, is the population growing, or declining?

Part 3: Migration

Net migration rates can be positive or negative; a positive net migration indicates immigration greater than emigration, and vice versa.

5. What is the net migration rate for the United States?
6. From what region of the world does the greatest number of immigrants to the United States come?

Part 4: Culture

In human geography, culture refers to ethnicity, language, and religion, in addition to elements of popular and traditional culture like music, clothing, and food. For the United States, find the following information:

7. Identify major ethnic groups, with their percentages
8. Identify major languages spoken, with their percentages
9. Identify major religions practiced, with their percentages

Part 5: Political Geography

10. In addition to the 50 states and the District of Columbia, the United States has many "dependent areas." Choose one and give a brief (2-3 sentences!) summary of how it became a dependency of the United States.
11. What type of government does the United States have (don't just say "democracy!" Look it up!)?
12. Select three international organizations in which the United States participates. For each, identify what the organization's acronym stands for and explain the purpose of the organization.

Part 6: Development

13. What is the GDP of the United States? How does it rank globally?
14. A country's economy is divided into sectors: primary (extraction), secondary (manufacturing), and tertiary (services). What sector of the economy is dominant in the United States?
15. To what country does the United States export the most?
16. From what country does the United States import the most?

Part 7: Land Use

17. What percentage of the US's population lives in urban areas?
18. Look at the rate of urbanization. Are cities in the US growing overall, or shrinking?
19. What percentage of the US is considered agricultural land?
20. What are the 5 most populous cities in the United States, with their populations? (make sure these are marked on your map!)
