<h3>Secondary Sources</h3> <p>Timelines are types of secondary source. A timeline is a diagram that shows the order of events in history. The date at the farthest left is the oldest date on the timeline. The date on the farthest right is the most recent date. Timelines can show us when events took place in relation to each other and can help us see cause and effect relationships.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Create a timeline of events in your life. Start with the year 2018 and end with the 2023.
