- Attend one District event and reflection submitted in Canvas
- Present professional learning to faculty, submit agenda, recording, reflection, and participant evaluations
- Complete Crowd Manager course
- Complete FEMA Incident Command System Training for School Administrators Course
- Completion of school-based project (Principal approved)
