4 Credits English Language Arts (ELA)

- ELA I, II, III, IV
- ELA honors, AP, AICE & dual enrollment courses may satisfy this requirement.

4 Credits Mathematics

- One of which must be Algebra I & one of which must be Geometry.
- Industry certifications that lead to college credit may substitute for up to two mathematics credits. (except for Algebra I & Geometry)

3 Credits Science

- One of which must be Biology I, two of which must be equally rigorous science courses.
- Two of the three required credits must have a laboratory component.
- An industry certification that leads to college credit substitutes for up to one science credit (except for Biology I).
- An identified rigorous computer science course with a related industry certification substitutes for up to one science credit (except Biology I).

3 Credits Social Studies

- 1 credit in World History
- 1 credit in U.S. History
- .5 credit in U.S. Government
- .5 credit in Economics with Financial Literacy

ADVANCED STUDIES CURRICULUM

Naples High School offers the Collier County Public Schools Advanced Studies Laureate Program to provide a rigorous academic course of study and to challenge and recognize high-achieving students. Although centered on College Board Advanced Placement (AP) and Cambridge Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) courses, the program encompasses other activities that enhance a student's general background and preparation for higher education. In addition to participating in at least two school-based demonstrations of excellence per year, students must present their 4,000-6,000 word Laureate essay to a panel of faculty and community members. The program assumes each candidate's exceptional motivation, aptitude, and achievement while encouraging high levels of integration of ideas and application of skills.
