EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

This board item applies to the purchase of a variety of items identified by individual cost category (and grant items where applicable) in the area of Curriculum and Instruction, which includes software license renewals, professional learning and other resources that provide academic content to support the academic growth of students relative to the Florida Standards, core and elective courses and Career and Technical Education (CTE) frameworks. Recommend approval of purchase from the vendors listed on the attached tabulation sheet, under provisions of FAC 6a-1.012(11). The total estimated exposure for the 2019-20 school year for these vendors is in the amount of \$3,580,000.00.

Anchor Learning (Reading Horizons)

Reading Horizons, a supplemental reading program, addresses student literacy needs at multiple levels. The program provides multiple resources: a K-3 foundational reading program for the young reader, a K-12 reading intervention program, reading instruction for English Language Learners (ELL), and an adult literacy component. Discovery is utilized within our elementary curriculum for K-3 ELL students. Elevate is utilized within the elementary and secondary curriculum for ELL students in grades 4-12. Adult learning implements Reading Horizons and EASY for ELL and GED students. The estimated exposure for the 2019-20 school year is in the amount of \$160,000.00.

AP Exams

College Board Advanced Placement (AP) exams are cumulative assessments administered at the conclusion of AP courses. These standardized exams are designed to measure students' levels of mastery of the content of the respective courses. AP courses may provide students with college credit dependent on exam scores and specific college/university requirements. AP professional learning for educators is supportive of AP courses and advanced studies. The estimated exposure for the 2019-20 school year is in the amount of \$550,000.00.

Artis-Naples

Students at multiple grade levels take part in experiences at Artis-Naples as a complement to the core and fine arts

curriculum. Professional learning for educators is provided through a collaborative partnership with Artis-Naples through a project with the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. The estimated exposure for the 2019-20 school year is in the amount of \$75,000.00.

Cambridge International Examinations

Cambridge International Examinations (CIE) is an advanced studies option in Collier County Public Schools' middle and high schools. CIE provides post-high school courses which may lead to a high school student earning an Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) diploma and post-secondary course credit. When students enroll in an AICE course, students self-select to participate in an AICE assessment, which is an internationally given assessment in a specific content area. At the middle school level, CIE provides a framework for an advanced studies option for students identified as gifted or high-achieving. CIE will also provide a framework for an advanced studies option for students identified as gifted or high-achieving at the elementary level. Purchases are made from Cambridge Assessment, University of Cambridge and its affiliates. The estimated exposure for the 2019-20 school year is in the amount of \$820,000.00.

Certiport

This is for the purchase of licenses and materials for the Certiport program offered by Career and Technical Education for students in grades 6 through 12 as each of Collier County high and middle schools are an authorized Certiport testing center. The district has been using Certiport as the only district wide industry certification provider since 2009. Purchases will continue to be made from Certiport, the sole source provider for the certifications that students take throughout the district. The estimated exposure for the 2019-20 school year is in the amount of \$325,000.00.

Curriculum Associates (iReady)

iReady is an adaptive diagnostic and instructional web-based tool aligned to the English Language Arts Florida Standards. Utilized at the elementary level, iReady includes assessment and instruction in the areas of phonics, phonological awareness, high-frequency words, vocabulary, comprehension of literature, and comprehension of informational text. This adaptive diagnostic and progress monitoring program uses advanced technology to provide a customized evaluation of every student and to track student growth and performance over the course of the year. Purchases are made from Curriculum Associates, Inc. The estimated exposure for the 2019-20 school year is in the amount of \$525,000.00.

Edmentum

Edmentum is a virtual recovery option for students who need an alternative way to earn and recover course credit. This virtual option offers a way to expand, enhance and extend program offerings so that students may meet graduation requirements. Additionally this delivery model allows for student to take courses for credit recovery and also earn initial credit through Collier Online Virtual Education (COVE) course offerings. The estimated exposure for the 2019-20 school year is in the amount of \$150,000.00.

Follett School Solutions

Follett's Destiny Library Manager and Destiny Textbook Manager provide centralized access to educator-reviewed digital content and tools that help media specialists, staff and students locate and share library resources along with inventory of instructional materials. Both Library Manager and Text Manager are resources found within the Follett School Solutions application package. The estimated exposure for the 2019-20 school year is in the amount of \$75,000.00.

Gale Cengage Learning

Gale Cengage Learning provides content and digital solutions for student and staff in cross-curricular research. These digital databases are utilized extensively by students and teachers for research across content areas. Single sign-on through the District's learning management system, allows anytime access to support teaching and learning. The estimated exposure for the 2019-20 school year is in the amount of \$80,000.00.

Naviance

Naviance is an on-line platform that provides students, parents and staff with numerous tools to support College and Career Readiness. This provides one location for students to upload documents, complete tasks, explore careers and potential post-secondary options. Students will ultimately be able to keep track of courses, GPA, test scores, areas of strength and potential areas of interest. The estimated exposure for the 2019-20 school year is in the amount of \$235,000.00.

Overdrive

Overdrive enables a districtwide catalog of digital content that includes eBooks and audiobooks. Some schools have added content by utilizing school-based Overdrive, Inc, accounts. Students and teachers may download digital content to their personal reader devices rather than checking out a physical book or audiotape from the school library. The estimated exposure for the 2019-20 school year is in the amount of \$75,000.00.

Terrapin –Tools for Thinking.

Coding with Blue-Bot and Tactile Reader focuses on the exploration of fundamental coding skills through a compilation of standards and skills learned through various content areas including English Language Arts (ELA), Math, Art, and Instructional Resource (IR). Kindergarten students will be introduced to basic coding and the concept of writing basic algorithms. Current expenditures for the 2018-19 school year from Terrapin Software for these items are at \$25,000.00. It is estimated an additional \$85,000.00 will be necessary for the purchase of items for the kindergarten program. To ensure these items are received, set-up and available for the start of the 2019-20 school year, purchase will be made upon board approval. The total estimated exposure for the 2018-19 school year is comprised of the \$25,000.00 expenditures and the \$85,000.00 kindergarten program for a total of \$110,000.00. The total estimated exposure for the 2019-20 school year is in the amount of \$50,000.00. The total exposure for Terrapin for the 2018-19 and the 2019-20 school years is in the amount of \$160,000.00.

TNTP

The partnership with TNTP is designed to strategically ensure all students, particularly the students working below grade-level have access to the four key resources essential to student learning and achievement — grade-appropriate assignments, strong instruction, deep engagement, and high expectations. This agreement will support instructional reviews, diagnostic activities and professional development. The estimated annual exposure for the 2019-20 school year is in the amount of \$350,000.00.
