Elective Course Requests

Cambridge Eligibility

Criteria for Participation:

- Eligibility for gifted services*, and/or
- Level of 4 or 5 on the statewide assessment (2019) for both English Language Arts and Mathematics, and
- GPA of at least 3.5

Cambridge Primary participation is not necessary for entry into Cambridge Secondary

School Supplies and Organizational Skills

- **Organizational skills are an important component of middle school success**
- **In 2020-21, students in grades 3-5 and 6 will have a consistent organizational system including color-coded folders and/or dividers for the various content areas (Math, English Language Arts, Social Studies, and Science)**
- **More information will be coming soon regarding school supply lists**

Dress Code

- **ID BADGES-** Students must wear an ID badge during the school day. ID badges must be visible and not in pocket or binder. Students are only allowed to wear one lanyard around their neck and lanyards should not be hanging from their pockets. Students will receive the first ID Badge for free and must pay \$5 to replace a lost one. If a student does not have their ID Badge, a temporary ID wristband will need to be purchased each day.
- **SHIRTS-** Shirts must be a solid polo-type shirt. Polo shirts must fall below the waistband but not past the finger tips. Any logos must be smaller than a half-dollar, with the exception of ENMS spirit shirts which are only to be worn on designated days. Undershirts/undergarments must be tucked in for both boys and girls
- **BOTTOMS-** For girls: Navy blue, black or khaki pants, Capri pants or walking shorts. Bottoms must be modest and not overly form-fitting. No skirts are allowed. No blue denims, yoga pants, tights, or sweat pants.
For boys: Navy blue, black or khaki pants or walking shorts. Oversized shorts/pants are not permitted. They may not be more than one size larger than what would be appropriate for the student. Shorts/pants must be worn at the waist. No denims. [Clarification: No athletic-type shorts/pants for either boys or girls]
- **SHOES/ SOCKS-** Athletic-type rubber soled shoes must have a closed toe, closed heel, and be laced or strapped. Socks must be neutral in color, be appropriate, and not cause a distraction. No ballerina style shoes or work boots are permitted.
- **OUTER WEAR-** Sweatshirts, hooded sweatshirts, or full zipper sweatshirts must have an ENMS Logo to be worn during the school day. These items may be purchased from the school. Other outerwear may be worn to school, but will remain in the student's locker throughout the school day.
- **HAIR-** Hair color must be a natural color and style shall not interfere with the educational process. Carvings, stripes and designs may not be part of the hair style or eye brows.
- **JEWELRY-** Must be modest and not cause a distraction.
- **VENDORS-** Although parents/guardians are free to purchase these clothing items anywhere they wish. ENMS is not promoting or requiring any brand. The only requirement is that shirts, pants and shorts are the appropriate colors and styles without graphics or lettering.

Student Lockers

- ENMS rents lockers to all students. Students may not share lockers. We offer the student the ability to rent a locker from ENMS each year. Students will be issued a locker upon payment of \$3.
