Our school offers parents the opportunity participate in parent conferences, MTSS discussions, ELL and IEP meetings. These meetings will be scheduled by the parent or the school so the child's individual progress can be discussed. Student Led Conferences are held twice a year for students to share their progress toward academic and behavioral goals with their parents. Monthly SAC meetings are also held to inform parents and community members about our school initiatives and academic progress.

During the teacher pre-service week, a parent involvement training is provided which reviews best practices in communicating with parents and involving them in their child's education. New teachers were provided extra training on establishing relationships with parents and honing their communication skills. Throughout the school year, teachers receive training on how to identify students who are struggling and creating effective Student Success Plans with parent input.	3	59	Staff learned ways to communicate with parents, involve them in their child's education, and welcome them to the school.
